



Saskatchewan Staycation Guide: Cypress Hills Interprovincial Park

Cypress Hills Interprovincial Park is one of Saskatchewan’s most unique destinations, offering a combination of forested highlands, rolling prairies, and panoramic autumn views. In September and October, the park’s trails and lookouts are illuminated with the golds, oranges, and reds of fall foliage, making it a haven for hikers, photographers, and nature lovers. The area is also renowned for its dark skies, perfect for stargazing and evening reflection. Visitors can enjoy hiking, lakeside picnics, and quiet walks among the changing trees, with opportunities to spot wildlife along the way. The mix of prairie and forest landscapes creates a rare and captivating autumn experience, distinct from other Canadian destinations.

Suggested Itinerary (2-3 Days)

Day 1

- » Arrive and hike to scenic viewpoints.

Day 2

- » Morning nature walk along forested trails.
- » Visit nearby communities and farm markets.

Day 3

- » Take a guided or self-led wildlife and foliage tour.
- » Enjoy a relaxing canoe or kayak trip.
- » Finish the day with a visit to local artisan shops.

Seasonal Tips

- Best time to visit is from September to mid-October for peak colours.
- Bring layers and hiking gear.
- Check park facilities before visiting.
